
## Arlene Weinstock—Turning CP Upside Down with Texture

Our February meeting featured member Arlene Weinstock's presentation on the various ways texture can be employed to enhance or take center stage in CP works.

First, Arlene covered some terms: **optical mixing**, where colors are placed side by side, or overlay each other to be mixed by the eye. Seeing Georges Seurat's pointillist works at a distance, the eyes and mind work together to blend dots of color into a smooth picture. In optical mixing, the artist uses color theory and how the eye perceives color to blend color, either through the use of thin translucent layers of color (glazing) to achieve a final perceived color, or to mix by placing colors side by side, such as red dots surrounded by yellow dots to achieve orange when viewed at a distance. This is the opposite of **physical mixing** - where paint colors are blended on a palette or surface to achieve a color.







Arlene's examples of optical mixing:

1. Seurat's "Rue Saint Vincent", 2. Degas' "Dancers", 3. Pissaro's "Self Portrait", 4. Monet's "Haystacks" and 5. Van Gogh's "Ladies of Arles". These colors vibrate with energy and movement rather than those via flat applications of mixed colors.

### Chapter Mini Workshop Continued:

Arlene's next concept: frottage, literally from French frotter "to rub".

Frottage is a method of creative production developed by Max Ernst, German painter, sculptor, graphic artist, artist, poet and primary pioneer of the Dada movement and Surrealism. In 1925 he invented a graphic art technique using pencil rubbings of objects as a source of images. Ernst was inspired by an ancient wooden floor, the grain accentuated by years of scrubbing. The graining suggested strange images to him, which he captured by laying sheets of paper on the floor and rubbing over them with a soft pencil.

In a drawing, frottage can be used as is or used as the basis for further refinement. Frottage differs from brass, stone and other rubbing type works intended to reproduce images, instead being characterized by chance or indeterminate elements.

Arlene supplied a wealth of textured surfaces, drawing materials and papers for experimentation. The goal? Thinking differently about texture and optical mixing for our colored pencil repertoire.


